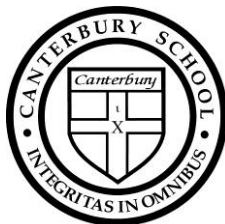

## **Canterbury reminds fans to “Honor the Game”**

**School will offer free popcorn to all fans at Saturday’s boys, girls matches against Homestead**

FORT WAYNE, Ind. – Canterbury and Homestead have been participants in one of the most fierce high school soccer rivalries in the area over the past decade. But this Saturday, Canterbury and athletics director Ken Harkenrider hope to redirect some of that passion toward a positive outcome.

Canterbury will host girls and boys varsity soccer matches against Homestead on Saturday evening, August 29. The girls game will begin at 6 p.m., with the boys to follow, and all fans will be greeted with a warm welcome and a coupon for free popcorn in exchange for a commitment to “Honor the Game” and all participants throughout the evening.

“We are excited to welcome players and fans from Homestead on Saturday, and we hope that everyone will join in supporting the players, coaches and officials in a positive manner before, during, and after both games,” said Harkenrider.

The event is an outgrowth of Canterbury's partnership with the Stanford University-based Positive Coaching Alliance and is a proactive attempt to create a fully positive environment for all athletic competitions at the school.
